## READINGS

### **Exodus 3:2-6**

The angel appeared to Moses in the shape of a flame of fire, coming from the middle of a bush. Moses looked; there was the bush blazing but it was not being burnt up. "I must go and look at this strange sight", Moses said, "and see why the bush is not burnt." Now God saw him go forward to look, and called to him from the middle of the bush. "Moses, Moses", he said. "Here I am", he answered. "Come no nearer", he said. "Take off your shoes, for the place on which you stand is holy ground".
