Carole Carmody rsm Carole is a Sister of Mercy and an experienced spiritual director with a special love for creating sacred spaces, and a reflective atmosphere. Carole believes in the capacity which each person has to depth their experience, and to discover the unique treasure within.

Cath Connelly: When not performing, composing or teaching the Celtic harp, Cath leads workshops and seminars on spirituality. In 2008, she completed her Master of Arts thesis in Spirituality through the Melbourne College of Divinity. During 2008 Cath also completed a four-year Spiritual Direction course offered by the Living Well Centre in East Melbourne. Consequently, Cath is now a qualified Spiritual Director, involved with the Leadership Team in providing spiritual direction training. In 2013 Cath became the co-director of the Living Well Centre in Melbourne. This is a position that she continues to hold. Her work increasingly involves leading retreats and facilitating workshops.
