Before You Start

There is an invitation on the participants' prayer sheet to create a prayer space and a journal if they wish before they enter into this prayer experience.

This reflection can be used as a guide, with others in a group reflection or, in your own sacred space.

Creating a Prayer Space

- Build your prayer space using pieces of fabric that might symbolise for you gratitude, simplicity and inclusion, wrapped in Mercy.
- Find some flowers or vine for your prayer space.
- Find a candle or decorate a candle with a colourful ribbon.
- Symbols can be added over the next few weeks as you reflect where you find mercy in your life and as a member/partner/associate of the Institute.

Create a Prayer Journal

- Designate a notebook as you Journal. You may wish to write, paint, or draw in your journal over the next few weeks.
- Consider designing a cover for your journal.

A space to reflect on what you are grateful for each day

- Before each meal reflect for a moment on where you have felt or seen and experienced God's presence.
- If you are in a group, share your reflections.

- If you are in the one venue invite someone to prepare the prayer focus.
- Photocopy a few copies of these notes or access this on an iPad.

'Mercying'

We in the Mercy family may now have reached one of the most demanding moments in our history. In living the Gospel call to be a Mercy presence, we now face the hard questions of further personal and social conversion to which we are all called.

To mercy another, to engage in mercying, to



mercify is to act and advocate, to heal and protect, to accompany and clear the way, to do the works of mercy in the world. We are asked to become humble, minor actors in the transforming mission of Jesus the Christ.

Through mercying, we may slowly awaken ourselves and others from the harmful sleep of our inhumanity. We know that universal love of all humanity is a daily and personal movement toward embracing and alleviating the sufferings of all our sisters and brothers – those we live with, those who live next door, those we see on television and in newspapers, those in Afghanistan, the Amazon Forest, Haiti, Cameroon, Yemen, Myanmar, the Philippines, Papua New Guinea, Tonga, and many other places. Mercying is a huge, Gospel-size calling to which we can respond only bit by bit. But as Catherine McAuley often told us: "If we are humble and sincere, God will finish in us the work God has begun. God never refuses God's grace to those who ask it" (Practical Sayings, 3). Catherine had another word of sound advice that may give us courage and confidence in our daily mercying. She said: "The simplest and most practical lesson I know is to resolve to be good today-- but better tomorrow. Let us take one day only in hands at a time, merely making a resolve for tomorrow. Thus we may hope to get on – taking short careful steps, not great strides" (CCMcA, 365). Let us press forward in our daily efforts to mercy.




