
The Call to Mercy

Gathering Rite:

A Call to Prayer:

Pause and share a few moments of silence, perhaps focusing on breathing to still your mind and come into the quiet. Light a candle. Use the words of this prayer to honour a movement now from ordinary time into sacred time.

Take some time in the quiet to reflect on this poem and contemplate the presence of Immensity in creation and in our experiences of late.


