The Spirituality of Mercy

Catherine McAuley wrote:

- Mercy, the principal path marked out by Jesus
 Christ for those who desire to follow him
- There are things the poor prize more highly than gold, though they cost the donor nothing; among these are the kind word, the gentle compassionate look, and the patient hearing of sorrows.
- ... walk in love as Christ loved us, preserving above all things, charity, which is the bond of perfection.

Catherine calls people of Mercy to that same generosity of spirit: We can never say 'it is enough'.

Catherine says of Prayer:

'Prayer is a plant, the seed of which is sown in the heart of every Christian, but its growth depends on the care we take to nourish it. If neglected, it will die. If nourished by constant practice, it will blossom and produce fruit in abundance.'


