Let your love, God, shape my life with salvation, exactly as you promised; Then I'll be able to stand up to mockery because I trusted your Word.

Take some time to reflect on the above short readings before continuing.

You might like to go for a short walk in nature, in your backyard, or in the gathering room - wherever you are situated.

Pope Francis suggests that we should ask: "Where are you?" and "Where is your brother?" He answers these questions by focusing on prayer, almsgiving and fasting. "Prayer, almsgiving, and fasting" he says, "are not three unrelated acts, but a single movement of openness and self-emptying, in which we cast out the idols that weigh us down, the attachments that imprison us." Prayer, almsgiving, and fasting, like the Ten Commandments, are "thoroughfares to freedom." Through prayer, almsgiving, and fasting, "we become brothers and sisters, more sensitive to one another: in place of threats and enemies, we discover companions and fellow travellers. This is God's dream, the promised land to which we journey once we have left our slavery behind." This is the meaning of allowing God to shape us.

Lent 2024 is an invitation to allow God, as Pope Francis says, "to whisper words of love into our hearts." It is an invitation to be shaped by love of God who now reveals God to us on the cross. I am proposing that the questions that guide us through Lent 2024 are:

"Am I willing to be shaped by God?"

"Where are you?" and "Where is your sister or brother?"

Prayer:

God of all wholeness, heal our hearts of all that prevents us responding to our sisters and brothers excluded by poverty and prevented from living a full and healthy life.

This Lent, may we implore justice through prayer, stand in solidarity through our fasting, and reach out through our giving.

Send your life-giving power to revive the weary, restore the broken and renew the face of the earth.

We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.
